



Hungarian virtuoso cellist and composer Pál Hermann wrote his epic cello concerto in 1925, but it remained incomplete on his tragic death in 1944.

90 years later the piece was reconstructed by Italian composer Fabio Conti, and is played tonight by soloist Sam Lucas on Hermann's own recently rediscovered instrument.

The first, Op.109 in E major, is marked "Gesangvoll, mit innigster Empfindung" (songfully, with utmost feeling), while Op.111, his last sonata, distils a whole orchestra into the piano's 88 keys, stretching both technique and imagination.

The journey ends with Beethoven's Op.110, song-like and cathartic, described by Vincent d'Indy as "an exertion of will to banish suffering" – the perfect conclusion to this unmissable recital.




